Obama designates Northeast Canyons and Seamounts Marine National Monument (The White House)

President Obama took another step in preserving a key conservation area with the designation of a new offshore monument 100-miles southeast of Cape Cod, Massachusetts. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

will manage the biodiverse seascape of canyons and seamounts and associated ecosystems in partnership with NOAA under the auspices of the National Wildlife Refuge System.
