## Species Chosen for NatureServe's Climate Change Vulnerability Assessment

**Species of high regional concern** – primarily "high responsibility species" and "high concern" species as identified in the Nature Conservancy's review of the 13 Northeast State Wildlife Action Plans

**Representative species** – species whose habitat needs or ecosystem function are similar to a group of other species. Most of those listed below were previously identified in a process led by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in the North Atlantic region.

**Foundational species** – species that are major determinants of ecosystem structure and function and that thus have a large influence on other species with which they co-occur.
